Robins has \$5.46 billion economic impact on Georgia

R

obins Air Force Base contributes \$5.46 billion to the Georgia economy, according to the installation's latest economic impact statement. That represents a 1.8 percent real growth in overall impact from the previous year.

Published annually, the statement provides general information about the economic impact the installation has on the state of Georgia.

The report is also distributed to federal, state and local officials.

The fiscal 2021 statement sizes Robins' workforce at 23,282 – a figure that is made up of 14,857 appropriated fund civilians, 5,692 military members and 2,733 other employees, including contract and non-appropriated fund employees.

The statement also says Robins doled out \$4 billion in salaries. The largest chunk of that money – \$1.17 billion – went to civilians working on base, while military members accounted for \$479 million. Non-federal civilians and contract employees accounted for just over \$22.3 million.

Additionally, the base awarded \$7.38 billion in contracts during fiscal 2021. In Georgia, the base awarded \$932.6 million. Of that amount Georgia firms in Houston and Bibb Counties accounted for 25 percent or \$232.9 million.

The analysis also showed the base's utility costs decreased by 3.29 percent.

NEW METHODOLOGY

This fiscal year our financial analysts employed a new methodology to derive our economic impact on the state of Georgia. The method they used mirrors corporate America with the major focus on dollar-based expenditures, or dollars spent, unlike the previous method, which was driven primarily by installation population. Some activities, such as military construction also weigh heavily on the final tally. And, according to Robins AFB financial experts, this new methodology is more accurate than previous methods used.
