How to Run an Effective Tournament

A successful tournament starts with planning.

1. Determine a date.
2. Don't do it alone. Have an assistant to help you.
3. Choose the format of the tournament. Almost every one plays a 4-person scramble that is handicapped.
4. Publicity: Advertise your tournament as far in advance as possible.
5. Sign Ups: If at all possible collect the entry fee when a person signs up.

They are more likely to show up when you do this. However this is not always possible. When signing up an annual green fee player please put his membership number by his name so we can confirm they are a member. Also put down a person golf handicap or average score if they do not have a USGA handicap so the teams can be handicapped by the golf pro.



Hints: Sponsorship is a great way to increase prizes, cut the cost on drinks, and help raise more money for your booster club, charity, etc.



Mulligans (Definition of a mulligan: If a player does not like the shot they just hit they may use a mulligan to do the shot over) are another fundraiser. Charge \$2- \$5 for mulligans.

Prizes: I have the philosophy that the more winners you have the better the tournament. Even if someone wins a \$5 gift certificate they are considered a winner. Most tournaments have 1 to 4 closest to the pins and long drives. You might be able to get one of the local businesses to donate a prize for these.

Example: Below is an example of the payoff based on \$700. Money is paid in gift certificates that are redeemable at the pro shop. Cash prizes are not allowed.

Closest to the Pin	2 x \$10 = \$20
Long Drive	2 x \$10 = \$20
First Place	4 x \$50 = \$200
Second Place	4 x \$40 = \$160
Third Place	4 x \$30 = \$120
Fourth Place	4 x \$20 = \$80
Fifth Place	4 x \$15 = \$60
Sixth Place	4 x \$10 = \$40
Total gift certificates	= \$700
