EXCEPTIONAL FAMILY MEMBER PROGRAM

EFMP is a mandatory enrollment program, administered by the AF Personnel Center (AFPC) that works with the medical community and key community agencies to identify Active Duty sponsors who have family members with special educational or medical needs. Exceptional Family Member Program – Family Support (EFMP-FS) is the community support component, provided by Airman and Family Readiness Centers (A&FRCs) that includes, but is not limited to, on-and off-base information and referral, parent training, support groups, relocations assistance, financial management and school information.

The portions of EFMP support provided by the AF Medical Service are known as the Special Needs Identification Assignment Coordination process (SNIAC). The SNIAC role is for identifying, enrolling, & providing medical/education clearance for relocation.

EFMP-FS and SNIAC work together with the Assignments branch at the Air Force Personnel Center (AFPC) to provide comprehensive and coordinated medical, education, community support, housing and personnel services to families with special needs.



The EFMP –FS is a to assist families with a variety of resources, including, but not limited to:

- * INFORMATION
- * REFERRALS
- * AIR FORCE AID/RESPITE
- * RELOCATION
- * SUPPORT
- * ACTIVITIES
- * TRAINING
- * CRISIS RESPONSE

The EFMP-FS is available to assist any DoD ID card holder.

SCHOOL LIAISON OFFICER

The School Liaison Officer is available to help ease the impact of students that are relocating to a new school. The SLO can help families and students with a variety of issues. Some concerns that military families often have after a reassignment is learning the new requirements for kindergarten registration, graduation requirements, home schooling laws, private school information, and local or state laws that often vary from state to state. The SLO has a close working relationship directly with the local board of education in assuring that the needs of military children are met. The SLO can also help with educational opportunities for military children, such as scholarships. The SLO is available to assist any DoD ID card holder.
