Col. David M. Abel is the Commander of the 5th Combat Communications Group at Robins Air Force Base, Georgia. The 5th MOB is the last remaining active duty combat communications group. The group of over 700 Airmen, Guardians, Civilians, and one United Kingdom officer from over twenty career fields is comprised of a combat communications support squadron, two combat communications mission squadrons and an engineering installation squadron. He directs the training, mobilization, and deployment of multi-capable personnel, computers, radios, transport systems, specialized engineering services and supporting equipment to enable wartime and peacetime operations for combatant commanders, joint task forces, and Air Force components and Department of Defense Agencies. These missions also include direct support taskings for the United States Northern Command and the United States Secret Service.



Col Abel is a native of California and was commissioned through the Reserve Officer Training Corps as a distinguished graduate in 1999.

Col Abel has served in numerous cyberspace operations command and staff tours. His command experience includes the 52d Combat Communications Squadron, 407th Expeditionary Support Squadron and 374th Communications Squadron. He has led in theater operations including Iraqi Freedom, Enduring Freedom and Inherent Resolve.
