SURVIVOR BENEFIT PLAN (SBP)

The SBP is a Government program which makes it possible for retiring members to ensure that after their death, their eligible survivors receive a portion of their retired pay in the form of a monthly annuity.

- One-on-one pre-retirement briefing to member and spouse
- Cancel/Change SBP (Retirees)

TRANSITION ASSISTANCE

Designed to provide retiring, separating, and demobilizing members (and family members) the information, skills and knowledge needed for successful transition. Transition assistance will be provided to DoD civilian employees (and family members) impacted by restructuring and reductions. Program components include:
