ECONOMIC IMPACT STATEMENT

ROBINS AFB HAS \$4.48 BILLION ECONOMIC IMPACT ON GEORGIA

Robins Air Force Base contributed \$4.48 billion to the Georgia economy in 2025, according to the installation's latest economic impact statement. That represents a 8.06% increase in overall impact from the previous year.

Published annually, the statement provides general information about the economic impact the installation has on the state of Georgia.

The report is also distributed to federal, state and local officials.

The fiscal 2025 statement sizes Robins' workforce at 21,506 Airmen - a figure that is made up of 14,154 appropriated fund civilians, 4,976 military members and 2,376 other employees, including contract and non-appropriated fund employees.

The statement also says Robins AFB paid out \$1.73 billion in salaries. The largest portion of that amount - \$1.29 billion - was paid to civilians working on base, while the military members received \$414 million. Non-appropriated fund employees accounted for just over \$18 million.

Additionally, the base awarded \$7.02 billion in contracts during fiscal year 2025. The base awarded \$670.8 million within the state of Georgia. Of that amount, Georgia firms in Houston, Bibb and Peach Counties accounted for 32%, or \$212.6 million.

The analysis also showed the base's utility costs increased by \$2.94 million.

METHODOLOGY

This fiscal year, our financial analysis focuses on dollar-based expenditures, or dollars spent, within a 50 mile radius of Robins AFB. According to Robins AFB financial experts, this methodology provides an accurate description of the installation's regional impact.
